Dear Mr. Zoley:

On March 9, 2020, we wrote to you requesting information about GEO Group's (GEO's) plans to prevent and manage an outbreak of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) in its facilities and protect the health and safety of incarcerated individuals, correctional staff, and their families. On March 12, 2020, GEO replied with a letter that failed to seriously address any of our questions and redirected all requests for information to the BOP. We are disturbed by GEO's refusal to provide critical information necessary to assess the steps it is taking in response to this crisis. In light of the ongoing public health emergency—and the recent reports of infections among incarcerated individuals and correctional staff at a GEO facility—we are following up on our letter to request that you immediately respond to the questions from our March 9, 2020 letter.

The COVID-19 outbreak has become significantly more dire over the last week, with confirmed cases in the United States alone increasing ten-fold. On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic.³ As of March 20, 2020, there are over 14,250 confirmed cases and 205 deaths from COVID-19 in the U.S.⁴ In response to this emergency, states around the country have taken drastic measures to reduce risk and "flatten the curve" of the outbreak.⁵ Forty-eight states have declared states of emergency, and in order to encourage social distancing, many have ordered the closure of schools, restaurants, bars, and other places

people congregate.⁶ Earlier this week, the White House advised all Americans to avoid gatherings of 10 or more people.⁷

The more than 175,000 people in the U.S. who are currently incarcerated in federal prisons and jails, and federal correctional staff and their families, are at especially high-risk of infection if an outbreak occurs in their facility, and would be particularly challenging to treat if infected with COVID-19.8

This is a real threat. Two staff members at federal prisons in New Hampshire and Texas have already tested positive for COVID-19.9 And on Friday, just days after our letter to you, GEO reported that 34 incarcerated individuals and staff at the GEO-managed George W. Hill Correctional Facility in Thornton, Pennsylvania were quarantined after an employee tested positive for COVID-19. Despite this important development, GEO has not publicly released its plan to protect against the threat of a COVID-19 outbreak.

We respectfully request a prompt response from GEO that provides thorough and complete answers to the questions outlined in our March 9, 2020 letter, no later than March 25, 2020.

Thank you for your attention to this urgent matter.
