Re: Comprehensive Addiction Resources Emergency (CARE) Act

Dear Senator Warren and Representative Cummings:

We write to express our support for the Comprehensive Addiction Resources Emergency (CARE) Act. This critical measure would invest \$100 billion in federal funding over ten years to fight the opioid epidemic, including a total of more than \$800 million a year provided directly to tribal governments and organizations.

The opioid epidemic has devastated many rural communities nationwide but has disproportionately impacted tribal communities. Tribes are at higher risk of disaster exposure and are disproportionately affected by public health emergencies. Many tribes cannot conduct robust public health surveillance of overdoses, engage in data-driven prevention efforts, develop and implement programs, and improve morbidity/mortality data collection and analysis.

We hold firm that this bill will provide tribal nations the tools and resources to combat the opioid epidemic. We thank you for your leadership and your efforts to pass this bill.
