Restore Military Families' Voices Act

Support for service members and military families includes ensuring they have a safe and sanitary place to live. Unfortunately, private housing companies that serve military families have too often evaded responsibility when they fail to provide adequate housing, using non-disclosure agreements (NDAs) to silence tenants.¹

The *Restore Military Families' Voices Act* would end the abuse of NDAs for military families living in privatized military housing. Specifically, the bill would:

- Ban landlords from requesting that military families sign NDAs. Under current law, a landlord may not require a tenant to sign an NDA in connection with a lease. The bill would strengthen that protection by prohibiting landlords from requesting that tenants sign NDAs, without affecting tenants' abilities to request NDAs.
- Expand NDA protections to cover all housing services. Existing law only limits NDAs for military families in connection with "entering into, continuing, or terminating a lease." The bill bolsters that language by prohibiting landlords from requesting NDAs in exchange for the provision of any services related to their housing units, including repairs.
- Eliminate the loophole that allows landlords to require NDAs for legal settlements. Under existing law, a landlord may require a tenant to sign an NDA in connection with a legal settlement. The bill eliminates that loophole, while leaving tenants with the opportunity to request an NDA in connection with a settlement if they so choose.
